The following courses will fulfill requirements for the Associate in Science and Arts Degree. It is designed for students who plan to transfer to E.M.U. and major in Elementary Education after completing the A.S.A. degree at M.C.C.

REQUIRED FOUNDATIONAL SKILLS – You must demonstrate a minimum level of achievement, either by successful testing or satisfactory course completion (a grade of “C” or better) in four areas:	
1. Writing	English 085, 089, 091 or 114
2. Reading	Reading 040A or 040C
3. Math	Mathematics 50 or 107 (or complete higher level course)
4. Computers	CIS 100 or any other CIS course (Consult a counselor regarding transferability. CIS 110 or 120A are strongly recommended.)

English, Reading and Mathematics Placement Tests may be required and are available in Testing Services, located in Room 134 – 777-0394. English and Reading placement tests may be waived if you show documentation of a proficiency level 1 or 2 on the high school MEAP or MME writing and reading tests or if you have an ACT composite score of 22 or greater. The Mathematics placement test may be waived if you show documentation of a score of 28 or above on the ACT Math test.

**TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM
ADMISSION: SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS**

Transfer students must first apply for admission to Eastern Michigan University at the Undergraduate Admissions Office. They may apply to the Teacher Education Program after successfully completing 12 hours at Eastern Michigan University, including at least one course in the major.

Criteria for admission to and continuance in the teacher education program are:

1. Completion of 56 hours with a minimum E.M.U. overall grade point average of 2.5 and at least 2.5 in the major (secondary and where applicable, elementary) or three minors (elementary).
2. Demonstrate competence in:
 - a. Speaking effectiveness as determined by successful completion of the required courses in speech with a minimum grade of "C".
 - b. Reading ability as determined by E.M.U. admission policies and successful completion of General Education Program Requirements and the state-mandated basic skills test.
 - c. Written expression as determined by a review of student's writing submitted as a part of the College of Education admission procedure, General Education Program Requirements and the state-mandated basic skills test.

- d. Mathematical Skills as determined by E.M.U. admissions policies and completion of General Education Program Requirements in science and mathematics with a grade of “C” or better, and completion of the state-mandated basic skills test.
 - e. All professional education courses must be completed with a grade of “C” or better.
3. Satisfactory health status.
 4. Social and emotional adjustment: account is taken of standards of conduct expected on Eastern’s campus; the degree to which students meet their academic, financial, moral, social, and other obligations; and the practice of good citizenship among fellow students.
 5. Freedom from any kind of probation – administrative or academic. While on academic probation, students may not register for, remain in, or receive credit for a professional education course. This includes all methods classes taught in departments outside of the College of Education.
 6. Students seeking admission to the certification programs must complete a test of basic skills. Visit www.mttc.nesinc.com for testing requirements.
 7. Freedom from moral turpitude issues.

A copy of the Basic Skills Test scores and an autobiographical statement must be attached to the student’s application.

NOTE: Please see the E.M.U. Undergraduate Catalog or consult the College of Education for information on the curricula in Elementary and Early Childhood Program, Secondary (middle school – high school) Program, and the K – 12 Program.

All prospective Elementary/Secondary Education teachers should attend a group advising session at E.M.U. Visit the teacher education web site at emich.edu/coe/advising to select an advising date.

Courses with grades of less than “C” or below 100-level will not transfer to E.M.U.

Students should check the M.C.C. catalog for course prerequisites.

It is recommended that Elementary Education majors become familiar with the College of Education section in the E.M.U. catalog.
